BADGES AND PARKING PERMITS:

No badges and parking permits will be required.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES:

Health certificates (CVI) are required on all animals and must be checked upon arrival on grounds.

LESIONS, FUNGUS AND DISEASE:

Any animal that exhibits visible signs of dermatitis, lesions, and/or fungus (ringworm), will immediately be removed from the grounds.

FEED AND BEDDING:

Feed of all kinds will be available through the Oklahoma Fair Park Feed Concession. Hay and feed may be brought in by Participants. First bedding will be provided for all cattle entered in the show. Straw WILL NOT BE ALLOWED in pen cattle tie-outs. Straw will be allowed in the Open and Junior cattle tie outs. Wood chips or wood shavings may be used for bedding.

CATTLEMEN'S CONGRESS NAME AND/OR LOGO USAGE:

Breed Association shows and sales are held within the confines of the Cattlemen's Congress grounds. CC, therefore, reserves all rights to any advertising, signage, announcements, etc., made on behalf of sponsors and supporters of the show. Accordingly, CC will not permit any sponsor advertising, signage, announcements, etc., other than those rights contracted directly with the CC, Breed Associations, members and Participants for sponsors they have obtained without written permission. CC looks forward to your cooperation in helping to protect its valuable trademarks and maintaining the high quality of merchandise that bear them.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

INTERPRETATION AND/OR ADMINISTRATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Specific or special rules and regulations or conditions are published in each division where necessary; if there is a conflict between the specific or special rules and regulations of any division and the General Rules and Regulations; Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations; Auction of Junior Livestock Champions Rules and Regulations; or The National Show Ring Code of Ethics, the specific or special rules and regulations will govern. If there is conflict between the General Rules and Regulations; Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations; Auction of Junior Livestock Champions Rules and Regulations; specific or special rules and regulations for any division and The National Show Ring Code of Ethics, the General Rules and Regulations; Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations; Auction of Junior Livestock Champions Rules and Regulations and specific and/or special rules and regulations will govern.

Violation of Rules. All entries of any kind or character and Participants in this annual exhibition are subject to these rules and regulations, and any violations will subject Participants to such penalties as Cattlemen's Congress may order and/or penalties prescribed by law.

Alteration of Conformation and Structure by Prohibited Substance or Unethical Fitting. Prohibited Substance and/or Unethical Fitting defined as: The injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State, or Local Law, or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law; the injection or internal or external administration of any product or material, whether gas, solid, or liquid, to an animal for the purpose of deception, including concealing, enhancing, or transforming the true conformation, configuration, color, breed, condition or age or by making the animal appear more sound than otherwise would appear; the administration, use or application of any drug or feed additive affecting the central nervous system; the administration of diuretics for cosmetic purposes, tissue manipulation, removal, surgical attachment or otherwise to change, conceal, enhance, or transform the true conformation or configuration of the animal; attaching to the hide foreign objects including hair or hair substitutes, cloth or fiber for the purpose of deception; any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conducive to the continued health or marketability of beef. Drenching will be allowed with drench guns, but the use of stomach pumps are prohibited. Violation of this rule will result in disqualification with no recourse and be subject to other sanctions.

The use of any grooming material which produces artificial color that may be detected by rubbing with a cloth or glove, use of hair or hair-like substance, cloth or fiber anywhere on the animal, ineligible age or illegal substitution of animals, violates these rules and will result in immediate disqualification with no recourse. Participant must leave the grounds immediately and be penalized \$150.00 per head. The

natural color of any beef animal cannot be altered using any artificial coloring. However, products that match a beef animal's natural color may be used in the fitting process from the knees and hocks down and on the switch only. For example, black products may be used on a black-legged animal, red on a red animal, and white on a white-legged animal. But under no circumstances can color be used to cover an animal's natural leg color.

Every Participant, by entering any animal for exhibition, thereby releases CC from all claims or demands whatsoever arising from any cause or happening in connection with the inspection of any such animal or any ruling or action taken by reason of the conclusion by Cattlemen's Congress under terms of this rule.

In the event any such animal is declared to be in violation of prohibited substance or unethical fitting as aforesaid, Cattlemen's Congress may disqualify and impose such penalties, in addition to those other penalties prescribed by law:

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS: Cattlemen's Congress reserves the right to cancel events or change scheduling if deemed necessary.

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY: All applications for entry must be made on current official Cattlemen's Congress printed entry forms or on-line by going to our official website. Entry forms may be found in the current Cattlemen's Congress Livestock Premium List, or on Cattlemen's Congress's web site, cattlemenscongress.com or may be obtained free of charge from the Cattlemen's Congress Livestock Office. All entries must be made on-line or mailed to the Livestock Office. Entry forms must be completely filled out in accordance with instructions on the same and signed by appropriate parties.

By submitting application for entry, Participant acknowledges they have read the Cattlemen's Congress Agreement of Responsibility and Liability; General Rules and Regulations; Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations; Auction of Junior Livestock Champions Rules and Regulations; specific and/or special division rules and regulations; The National Show Ring Code of Ethics and the Quality Assurance

Certificate in accordance with the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, and agree to observe and abide by these rules and regulations.

All entries, unless otherwise specified, must be made online on or before November 20, 2020. All Canadian and International Participants must pay all fees in United States funds. (No Foreign Checks will be accepted).

ACCEPTED ENTRIES: In all cases, Cattlemen's Congress reserves the right to reject, accept, or conditionally accept any entry from any Participant in violation of any rules and regulations from any Livestock Exhibition, Show or Sale that is sponsored by or under the authority of the State or any unit of Local Government or Agricultural, Horticultural or Livestock Society, Association or Corporation. Cattlemen's Congress does not guarantee space in the show barns to any entry, as it is intended that only such animals shall be entered and shown that have merit and will be a credit to both the Participant

and this exposition. The Cattlemen's Congress may appoint a special committee on the opening day of the show to look over the animals entered for exhibition and upon the recommendation of said committee that any animal or animals which do not have such merit as would entitle them to exhibit, Cattlemen's Congress may require them removed from the grounds. Cattlemen's Congress reserves to itself the right to withdraw classification and prizes in any department, upon the closing of entries, where it is found the animals entered would be discreditable to the exhibition.

OWNERSHIP OF ANIMALS: Breeding animals in the junior show must be the property of the owner and transferred on or before December 1, 2020. Animals cannot change ownership or be transferred from one program to the other.

GROUP CLASSES: Individual animals that are shown in any group classes, must first have been entered and shown in one (1) of the classes for single animals.

USE OF ANIMALS FOR JUDGING CONTESTS: All animals entered are subject to use for the Collegiate, Intercollegiate Judging Contest.

CARE OF ANIMALS: Participants will be required to attend to their animals while on exhibition and to have them presented to the Judges when called for.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS: **NO entry fees will be refunded.** Cancellations received after deadline date will not be refunded, no exceptions.

LATE ENTRIES AND SUBSTITUTIONS: Late entries for Open, Junior Breeding Heifers and Pen Shows will be accepted until December 10, with an added late fee of \$50.00 per head entered. Substitutions within the same class and same owner only will be accepted. There will be no substitution of animals in different classes. Substitutions must be in **no later than December 10, 2020.**

BREED REGISTRATION AND PRACTICES: An animal is eligible to enter or compete in the Cattlemen's Congress in only one (1) breed classification regardless if the animal is registered in one (1) or more breed associations or registries. Furthermore, the animal must be registered in the recognized U.S. registry for their breed classification or, if registered in the country of origin outside the U.S., the animal must be eligible for registry in the recognized U.S. registry. Each breed association shall have the sole responsibility to assure that its breed registration rules, regulations, procedures, and/or other communications including by way of illustration but not limitation, those relating to percentages of permitted cross breeding, are providing reasonable information to all parties relying upon its breed registration programs and to avoid any deceptive practices and/or unlawful conduct whatsoever. Each Association shall further indemnify, save and hold Cattlemen's Congress and the City of Oklahoma City harmless against any and all losses, claims, costs and/or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses and court costs, resulting from any loss or any claims or legal action of any nature whatsoever, whether or not reduced to judgment, for any liability of any nature whatsoever that may arise against Cattlemen's Congress relating in any way to the development and/or implementation of the breed association's breed registration rules, regulations and/or procedures.

TIE-OUTS: A limited number of tie-outs will be provided for cattle. Stalls will be assigned at the time entry fees are completely paid.

FACILITY SPACE/NUMBER OF ENTRIES: If the number of entries exceeds the facility, Cattlemen's Congress reserves the right to reduce entries as necessary.

ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.

ASSIGNMENT OF PENS AND STALLS: The assignment of stalls will be made at the time entry fees are completely paid and only to animals that arrive at the show. Space will not be assigned for animals entered that do not arrive on the grounds. Entry fees do not dictate stall space. Entry fees will not be refunded. Participants will only receive one (1) stall for every animal delivered to the Cattlemen's Congress, regardless of the number of entries made. A cow-calf pair is considered as one (1) entry; but the Participant is given two (2) stall spaces for the unit. There is no guarantee the requests can or will be honored.

APPEARANCE OF EXHIBITS: The stalls, pens and exhibition places must be cleaned before 7:00 a.m. each day. For those Participants refusing to keep their stalls, pens and/or exhibits clean and neat, the show reserves the right to have said stalls or pens properly cleaned with the cost to be charged against the Participant. Said cost will be collected from the Participant before release is issued. Participants should be neatly dressed when they take their animals into the show ring.

JUDGES: Judges are earnestly requested to familiarize themselves with all the rules and regulations of this show, and to especially mark those rules bearing on the classes to be judged by them.

TIME OF JUDGING: The time of judging for all divisions is tentatively listed in this book and on the Cattlemen's Congress website. Any changes will be announced by the public address announcer in a timely manner.

DECISION OF THE JUDGE FINAL: The decision of the Judges shall be final in all cases. In cases where fraud, misrepresentation, error or collusion is discovered after awards have been given, Cattlemen's Congress or such referee as may be appointed by Cattlemen's Congress, may make a decision regarding final placement, from whose decision there will be no appeal.

AWARDING CHAMPION PRIZES: Judges are directed in all champion classes to provide for a reserve animal. Only first prize winners will be permitted to compete for championships. Second prize winner in class from which champion is chosen is eligible to compete for reserve champion.

PROTESTS: All protests must be in writing and be accompanied by five hundred (\$500.00) dollars cash or certified check which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to Cattlemen's Congress immediately after the occasion for such protest. Protests must be submitted either prior to judging or immediately after the conclusion of class judging. Once an animal reaches championship judging, no protest will be

accepted. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that Judges overlooked an animal will be considered.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS: With the accepted entry in this show, Participants are expected to keep their animals on grounds until the designated time for release, unless otherwise provided for in these regulations (refer to Arrival and Release Dates and Times). If necessary, individual animals sold in auctions on the show grounds may be released by securing the consent of the management.

FORCE MAJEURE AND GOVERNMENTAL REGULATION: In view of the fact that the Cattlemen's Congress is a non-profit corporation depending to a great degree upon the contributions and services of a substantial number of donors and volunteers, as well as the benefits provided by Cattlemen's Congress to the general public through education and related services as set forth in the Preamble to these General Rules and Regulations, Cattlemen's Congress deems it appropriate and prudent to be excused from liability, as set forth below in this paragraph, in the event of early cancellation of its events, operations and activities by reason of force majeure and/or governmental regulation. Accordingly, the following shall apply to the operations and activities conducted by the Cattlemen's Congress.

FORCE MAJEURE: Cattlemen's Congress shall not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its operations activities, shows and events to the extent such delay or failure results from a force majeure occurrence. A force majeure occurrence is defined as any occurrence arising from causes beyond the reasonable control of CC and which delays or prevents performance by CC otherwise required by this Agreement, including but not limited to any (i) breakage or accident to equipment, machinery or facilities; (ii) any strikes, lock-outs or other labor difficulties; (iii) statutes, ordinances, regulations, orders, or rules issued by governmental authorities relate to COVID 19 or other pandemic matters; (iv) judicial decrees or orders; (v) acts of God; (vi) animal diseases and/or quarantines; (vii) wars, riots or insurrections; (viii) civil disobediences, public demonstrations or sabotage; (ix) fires, floods, explosions or inclement weather; (x) inability to obtain necessary labor, materials, supplies, utilities or transportation; (xi) depressions, recessions or other economic downturns; (xii) embargoes or energy shortages; or (xiii) other causes beyond Cattlemen's Congress's reasonable control.

IMPORTANT ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION UPDATE:

An official CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to the Cattlemen's Congress must accompany all animals and shall be available at all times to the representatives of the Animal Industry Services of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture. **ALL LIVESTOCK MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (HEALTH CERTIFICATES), WHICH MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING.** All CVIs must be validated by Animal Industry Services before animals are given stall or pen space in the barns. All animals must be free of any infectious, communicable or contagious disease and if such a disease is found, it will be cause for removal of the animal(s) from the exhibition. **For questions regarding testing, CVI's, official identification, or import requirements, please call Animal Industry Services at: 405-522-6141.**

All cattle moving interstate for exhibition or show events, are required to have official individual identification ear tags present in the ear. To avoid potential problems, all U.S. cattle entering the show grounds will be expected to have a USDA Official ID ear tag present in the ear. The following tags are considered official: Orange Metal Official, Calfhood Vaccinate (OCV/Bang's) tag, Silver Metal USDA tag, 840 RFID tag, visual/panel 840 ear tag, or an ear tag with the U.S. seal and "Unlawful to Remove" plus a unique animal number. Examples of these tags are below. 1. Breeding Cattle: Judges are instructed to award prizes for breeding cattle in the different classes and in the order in which they, as buyers, would make selection for breeding purposes. The primary objective of the show is to encourage the breeding and feeding of improved breeds and types of livestock for well-defined practical purposes. In groups, encouragement will be given to uniformity of breed type.

2. Bulls: A bull over one year of age without a ring in his nose will be excluded from exhibition in the interest and the safety of spectators.

3. Breed Association Sales: All animals entered in any of the sales must be entered in a show class and with their National Breed Association.

4. Breed Registration: Any animal entered in any of the bull or heifer Pen Divisions are eligible to show in the individual classes in any of the open breeding shows.

5. Paint: No paint/coloring agents may be used in the make-up areas or show arenas.

6. Canadian Cattle Requirements: Cattle originating from Canada are required to have a legible ear tattoo. Those animals to be sold or that will stay in the U.S. are required to have a CAN brand and legible tattoo.

7. Rules and Regulations: General Rules and Regulations apply to this division as well as those rules listed below and in specific breed divisions, ie: Angus, Charolais, etc.

2. The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expenses and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

3. A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.

4. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head).

5. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

6. Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in.

7. Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

8. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly to the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

9. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

10. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such shows shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

11. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

12. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

BREEDING SHOW CLASSIFICATION:

The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest class with each class made up of no more than fifteen (15) heads.

All Canadian and International exhibitors must pay all fees in United States funds. All entries are due on or before November 20, 2020. All entries must be made online at www.cattlemenscongress.com
2. All entries must be halter broke to lead, as they will be shown individually in the Arena.
3. Animals competing in the Braunvieh Show must be registered in the Braunvieh Association of America (BAA) Herd Book.
4. Exhibitors must be in good standing with the Braunvieh Association of America. Exhibitors must comply with the rules and regulations of the Cattlemen's Congress. All animals exhibited must have a DNA sample on file with the Braunvieh Association of America. A hair, tissue or blood sample on the subject animal must be received by the BAA or BAA representative prior to the show.
5. All animals exhibited must have a known Braunvieh dam or sire and are subject to being DNA verified to its Braunvieh parent(s).
6. Animals must be Full Blood or Purebred (7/8 Braunvieh blood for females and 15/16 Braunvieh blood for males) to qualify for the FB/PB Braunvieh show. Animals with less than purebred Braunvieh blood, and 1/8 or greater Braunvieh blood, will be shown in a separate Braunvieh Beefbuilder/Percentage show. (All fractions based on breed up percentages.)
7. The BAA reserves the right to provide the judge and audience with the Expected Progeny Difference (EPDs) values, ultrasound data (collected by a certified technician), scrotal circumference for bulls, weights and ratios for performance and weights with weight per day of age. These performance figures

(including weights, hip heights and frame scores) can be presented in their entirety or any combination deemed necessary by the BAA.

8. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older (not females in the cow/calf class) must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy by a licensed veterinarian. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.

9. Females born prior to September 1, 2018 must show in the cow/calf class with a calf at side. The pair will not be eligible for champion female/heifer. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. Calves from the cow/calf class can be entered as individuals in the show.

10. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must have a positive semen test and a certificate to that effect. The certificate must be available for inspection. Bulls 12 months and older must have a nose ring to be shown.

11. Braunvieh entries will be entered in a specific show class at time of entry.

12. No dyes, paints or other substances to alter animals natural color will be allowed. Violation will result in disqualification

13. No cosmetic surgeries other than surgical dehorning will be allowed. Violation will result in disqualification.

14. Only generally accepted fitting practices will be allowed. Violation will be cause for disqualification. Show committee will make ruling on a case by case basis. 4. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
5. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.
6. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

7. Bulls from classes 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

8. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow/Calf class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2018. Calves must be purebred and registered with AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2018, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

9. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

10. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggests that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

11. ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

11. Article XV, Paragraph B, Point 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus), is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

12. Effective October 22, 2004, at any American International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. 1. The Cattlemen's Congress will charge and collect an entry fee of seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars per head entered and a fifty (\$50.00) per head entered mandatory bedding fee. All Canadian and International exhibitors must pay all fees in United States funds. All entries are due on or before November 20, 2020. All entries must be made online at www.cattlemenscongress.com
2. Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle will each compete within their respective shows. Group classes can be made up of a combination of Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle, but no group can be entirely made up of Balancers.
3. All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor prior to December 15, 2020. A copy of the registration paper or an affidavit of registration must accompany each entry to the show. All cattle will show by the breed percentage rules adopted by the AGA Board of Directors that determines animal category. Animals are placed in the category based on the rule of the year that animal was born: "Percentage, purebred and full blood Gelbvieh females seventy-five (75%) percent to one hundred (100%) percent by category will show together in the Gelbvieh show. Percentage, purebred and full-blood Gelbvieh bulls seventy-five (75%) percent to one hundred (100%) percent by category will show together in the Gelbvieh show. A 75% Gelbvieh female or bull that is 25% Angus or Red Angus can choose whether to show as Gelbvieh or Balancer at the time of entry. No changes can be made after the entry deadline. A 75% Gelbvieh female or bull that is 25% other (Hereford, Simmental, etc.) does not have a choice and must show in the Gelbvieh show." To qualify for the Balancer® Show all cattle must

meet the American Gelbvieh Association's Balancer trademark rules for registration as a Balancer. Exhibitor must designate Gelbvieh or Balancer as breed on the entry form.

4. Proof of satisfactory semen evaluation for bulls twelve (12) months of age or older as of December 31 must be submitted at the time of check-in. Bulls over two (2) years of age must have a semen evaluation certificate issued within 90 days of the show.

5. Cattle must be entered and under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline date. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.

6. All animals must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix, and will be inspected at the show. If the tattoo is illegible or does not correspond to registration certificate, the animal is ineligible to show or may be re-tattooed by the exhibitor and re-checked at the end of processing for a fee of \$50, payable at that time.

7. All protests against exhibitors, dealing with age or genetic background of show cattle, must be in writing and signed by five (5) active members of the AGA, accompanied by one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars in cash, unless more is required by the show, and then presented to the show Superintendent within twelve (12) hours before starting of the show.

8. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the Show Management. Any deviation from the health requirements will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.

9. Show committee prohibits the use of powders of any color, false tailheads and glued-on hair or hair-like substances.

10. All bulls must show with a noselead. Entry into the show ring without one will be an automatic disqualification. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show committee.

11. All females born 09/01/18 - 04/30/19 must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian. Exception to the rule will apply to a donor female that has produced fertile eggs in the previous twelve (12) months as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian or has a natural calf at side.

12. All females shown in cow/calf class with a calf over one hundred fifty (150) days of age must be bred back and must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian. Exception to the rule of safe in calf will apply to a donor female that has produced fertile eggs in the previous twelve (12) months as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian.

13. Age of calf at side in cow/calf class must not exceed two hundred forty (240) days as of date of the show.

14. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing.

15. The following data will be provided to the judge for consideration and will also be included in the show program: frame score, weight at the show, scrotal circumference, and the most current EPDs. Neither actual or adjusted birth weight, weaning weight or yearling weight will be provided.

16. Classes will be split as evenly as possible after processing. Splits will be decided using total entries at processing.

17. Cattlemen's Congress will stall all Gelbvieh and Balancer Open Show entries. Direct all requests to Cattlemen's Congress on entry form.

18. During processing individuals will take scrotal measurements. To minimize variation in data collection, individuals collecting data will process all entries.

19. After animals have left the chute following initial processing, they may be re-measured once with the payment of \$50 per head at time of re-measurement. The second measurement is final and will replace the original measurement. Re-measurement will only be done at conclusion of regular processing.

20. Sweater vest is required for all handlers. Vest will be available at check-in or call AGA office prior to the show.

21. It is expected and required that all parties involved in any Gelbvieh or Balancer show shall respect, cooperate, and be courteous to the judge, show management, exhibitors, the American Gelbvieh Association, AGA staff, and spectators before, during, or after a show. If an exhibitor, employee, or family member of exhibiting operation should violate this via phone call, text message, email, social media, and/or in person, that operation will be removed from the show and/or be banned from exhibiting in any Gelbvieh or Balancer show for a year including AGJA Junior Nationals and the national Gelbvieh and Balancer show. Any Gelbvieh or Balancer animal co-owned by offending operation will also not be allowed to be exhibited at any AGA sanctioned show for that year.

22. The AGA follows the National Show Ring Code of Ethics. If these codes of ethics are violated, disciplinary action will be taken by the AGA Executive Committee.

1. The Cattlemen's Congress will charge and collect an entry fee of seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars per head entered and a fifty (\$50.00) per head entered mandatory bedding fee. All Canadian and International exhibitors must pay all fees in United States funds. All entries are due on or before November 20, 2020. All entries must be made online at www.cattlemenscongress.com
2. Cattle entered must be registered (including calves on the side of dams) in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association. Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check - in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the American Hereford Association special rule on class qualification. Entries in these classes are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
3. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed.
4. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of graphite, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids or growth stimulants internally.
5. The act of artificially filling animals internally. Which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method by mouth or esophagus is prohibited.
6. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their respective single age class. No transfer from one (1) breeder to another, after entry, will be permitted.

7. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show, but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data
8. It is recommended by the AHA Show Committee that classes with 10 or more head be considered to be split depending on animals' birthdates in each particular class.
9. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
10. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) thirty (30) days prior to show date to be eligible to show at a National Hereford Show.
11. An animal that is scurred (Scurs are small, rudimentary horns that are loosely attached to the head, which are considered to be expressed only in animals that are genetically heterozygous for the polled gene) will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed to be scurred by an AHA field representative, then this designation will be placed on the animal's registration papers. Once this determination has been made and reported to the AHA office, then the owner may remove the scurs. Animals with scurs removed will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed polled or scurred they will retain this designation forever.
12. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest within each class.
13. Calves on the side of cow-calf pairs MUST BE the cow's natural calf for cattle exhibited at the show Exhibitors with senior bull calves, intermediate, yearling & senior bulls are required to provide a licensed veterinarian's statement indicating the bull has been semen checked and evaluated as fertile. Semen evaluation is to occur within 90 days of the show. This statement must be presented at check-in during the Cattlemen's Congress. Exhibitors with females in the spring and junior yearling divisions must be confirmed pregnant within 45 days of show by a licensed veterinarian or by blood test or show with a calf at side.

2. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation.

3. All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be:

A. 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates

OR

B. Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates.

Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.

4. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.

5. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.

6. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:

a) Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or other substances; animals may be subject to a white-towel test;

b) The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);

c) The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;

d) Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. That includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method.

EXCEPTION: In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. That exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

6. Bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.

7. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion.

8. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.

9. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.

10. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birthmarks.

11. Class size shall be to the discretion of the show superintendent and may not contain more than 20 head. The given classes may be split or combined only within their given division.

12. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow-calf division are eligible to show as individuals.

13. Following the selection of Grand and Reserve Champion Cow/Calf Pair there will be the selection of Supreme Female to be chosen from the Champion Female and Champion Cow/Calf Pair. Supreme Female will not receive additional MOE points.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

The following performance-data-submission requirements must be met by December. 1 to receive Medal of Excellence points.

NOTE: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special requests from NALF.

Credibility Requirement: To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors are expected to adhere to all NALF rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle and to adhere to rules and regulations of particular shows, fairs and exhibitions.

Bulls born September 1, 2018 thru July 31, 2020 must be entered with the understanding if they win the After 5 Club purse of \$10,000.00 or more, they must provide 500 or more units of semen (20 units per After 5 member) by June 1st to be distributed to After 5 Club members or declare otherwise at check in time.

Winning bull must have BW, WW, YW (if applicable) recorded with NALF and meet all requirements to be an

AI-verified sire to receive the prize money. It is recommended that all bulls be GE-EPD's by NWSS time. Exhibitors must be a member of After 5 Club to receive the full amount, non-members receive 50% of the premium purse.

Selection

The Open show judge would select all division champions, and reserve champions. He would make his final decision – Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion bull without announcing his decision. The judge would then take a 20 minute break.

The After 5 club members or their duly authorized representative (managers or managing partner – no proxies) would receive a ballot. Each ballot shall list each bull in the ring (1 thru 12) in order of preference.

Once the ballots are turned in for tabulating the open judge can complete his duties by naming the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bull. Following his selection the results of the After 5 balloting will be announced – with the low vote getter being the After 5 Club Champion and recipient of the premium purse.

In event of a tie vote the judge's decision shall break the tie. Ballots will be posted after the show.

2. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association. When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide with the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the Show Management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the show rules, may be disqualified from showing.
3. All animals must be registered in the AMAA or CMAA and the original certificate is required for presentation before the show. Exhibitors must be current members of the AMAA or AJMAA.
4. All animals must be seventy-five percent (75%) Maine-Anjou or greater in the Maine-Anjou Show. Maine-Angus Qualifications: All Maine Angus Females must be TH and PHA Free by either parents or test have an AMAA issued Maine Angus registration paper and meet Maine Angus color requirements.
5. Bulls and females in the MaineTainer Division must be registered 1/4 - 5/8's Maine-Anjou.
6. Tattoo will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate. Other than Brucellosis Calhood tattoo, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.

7. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
8. The use of false tailheads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
9. The dying or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and color will be prohibited.
10. No artificial filling allowed (no pumps).
11. All horned animals over seven (7) months of age must be dehorned.
12. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have hair pulled for parentage verification. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of DNA, the owner may at his expense, request the AMAA determine the actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in a review before the AMAA Executive Committee.
13. Bulls ten (10) months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
14. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
15. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
16. Bulls exhibited must be Th/Pha free by test or parentage.
17. Exhibitors shall wear show harnesses to exhibit entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA sponsored shows.
18. Classes of animals shall be split as near to equal numbers as possible by the show superintendents.

AMAA PROTEST RULES

1. Written protests are submitted 24 hours prior to the beginning of judging.

c. Substitutions will only be permitted for animals within sex, according to the hosting show's deadline

GENERAL REGULATIONS:

- a. Entries are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the Rules and Regulations of the RAAA. Enforcement will be at the discretion of the RAAA authorized representatives and may include barring an animal or exhibitor.
- b. Exhibitors shall exhibit sportsmanship and professional behavior in and around the show ring. Abusive, discourteous, or threatening behavior towards judges, show officials, fellow exhibitors or RAAA authorized representatives will not be tolerated.
- c. All animals must have legible tattoos, which match the Animal ID and Herd Prefix as recorded in the RAAA database prior to processing.
 - i. Animal ID and Herd Prefix verification may be via printed registration certificate or real time electronic representation of the RAAA database.
 - ii. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are not legible and cannot be read during processing, it will be allowed to participate in the show. A fee of \$100 will be charged to the exhibitor for a DNA parentage test of said animal.
 - iii. If the animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are legible but are incorrect and/or no visible indications of a tattoo in either ear, the animal will not be allowed to show.
- d. Each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting and grooming practices.
- e. NO pumping.
- f. The use of coloring agents, paints, and/or the addition of any hair or hair-like substances will not be allowed.
- g. At the time of processing, all females 20 months of age or older on publicized date of show must have the one of the following:
 - i. Certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian.
 - ii. Written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist of having produced fertile eggs.
 - iii. A female's own natural born calf at side, (the calf may not be a ET calf) which need not be registered, but must be eligible for category 1A or 1B registration in the RAAA.

5. The assignment of pens will be made at the time entry fees are completely paid and only to animals that arrive at the show. Entry fees do not dictate pen space. Night pen and tie-out space will be assigned separately from the exhibit pens.

6. Three (3) bulls or three (3) females per exhibitor from the Pen divisions may sell in the official breed association sale with the exception of those breeds which specify otherwise, provided they are selected in time to be catalogued for the sale by the breed association except for the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Pen. In addition, uncataloged bulls or females from the Pen division champion will be allowed to enter the sale not to exceed five (5) head from any breed. The breed association accepts full responsibility and liability of the transfer of the animal. The bulls or females are to be returned to their respective pens immediately following the sale to remain on display until release time.

7. All alternate bulls must be designated and processed on the day of check-in with the breed association.

8. Only those animals within the specific ages for the listed classes will be eligible to show (unless otherwise specified by breed association).

9. Health papers must be turned in upon arrival.

3. All heifers must be registered in the National Herd Book of the breed. The entry must show the name, the age and the registration number of the competing animal. 4. Participant must be enrolled in the project in which they are exhibiting. All heifers ownership must be shown by breed registry issue/transfer date. Registration must be in the name of Participant as of December 1st (no late entry fee will be charged on the heifers bought after November 20th and before December 1st). Those heifers sold in Breed Association sales will be allowed to be shown by Junior Exhibitor entering the heifer with approval of the new owner.

The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.

Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

To be eligible for Association premiums the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have the original registration certificate at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of

false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a “white towel” or “white glove” test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates in the animals entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such

substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except the external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

2. Participant must be 8 and/or 3rd grade -20 years of age as of January 1, 2021.
3. A negative BVD-PI test is required on all steers prior to entering the grounds.
4. Official weight: A weight must be filled out by all Junior Market Steer exhibitors and turned in at processing with a called/declared weight. This will become the official weight. and cannot be changed. All junior market steers will be divided into classes according to this weight. Minimum weight for Market Steer is one thousand (1,000) pounds.
5. All junior market steers will be weighed prior to entering the show ring. Any junior market steers outside of the 5% tolerance from the called weight will be disqualified.
6. Drenching will be allowed with drench guns, but the use of stomach pumps are prohibited. Violation of this rule will result in disqualification with no recourse and be subject to other sanctions.
7. Stall Assignments: management can assign stalls to any exhibitor at its discretion.
8. The natural color of a steer cannot be altered using any artificial coloring. However, products that match the animal's natural color may be used in the fitting process from the knees and hocks down

and on the switch only. For example, black products may be used on a black-legged animal, red on a red animal and white on a white-legged animal. But under no circumstances can color be used to cover an animal's natural leg color.

9. No substitutions will be allowed!
10. Each Junior Market steer exhibitor will be allowed to bring one (1) blocking chute onto the show grounds. No fans attached to a cart or dolly. All fans must be suspended.
11. Classes are tentatively scheduled for a Crossbred division. Classes will be broken by weight within a division.
