- 1. Cattle entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association. Polled and horned will show together in all miniature classes. Entries with registrations pending, illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Maximum height at hip to be shown in these classes is 45" on mature females, 48" on mature males. All entries will be measured at check in. Those exceeding the height requirement will be disqualified from competition.
- 2. Exhibitors with bulls born before January 1, 2022, in the sale or for sale are required to provide a licensed veterinarian's statement indicating the bull has been semen checked and evaluated as fertile. Semen evaluation is to occur within 90 days of the show. This statement must be presented at check-in during the Cattlemen's Congress.
- 3. All exhibitors with animals in the sale, please see health requirements for cattle consignment sales in the front of this book.
- 4. Entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the AHA Board of Directors and are subject to supervision of the Show and Sale Committee representing the AHA and its rules.
- 5. Surgery or other procedure performed to change the natural process of growth, maturation, contour, or appearance of any animal to include teeth, is prohibited. Not included is removal of teats or horns, clipping and dressing of hair, and trimming of hooves.

DECISION OF SHOW SUPERINTENDENTS WILL BE FINAL

#### **CLASSES**

Classes will be divided after all entries are weighed and measured.

Division Champions and Reserves will be chosen from class winners and runner up to champion in classes.

The female classes will consist of females born on or after August 1, 2021.

The bull classes will consist of bulls born on or after January 1, 2021.

The cow/calf classes will consist of any females born before July 31, 2021.

#### **FEMALE CLASSES**

Champion and Reserve Champion Pair of Bulls

O1 Get of Sire - Three animals by one sire must have been shown in above classes.

Both sexe's represented. All animals must be shown in individual classes.

Awarded with the following point system: 1st place = 5 points, 2nd place = 4 points, 3rd place = 3 points, 4th place = 2 points and 5th place = 1 point. No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded to Best 2 Females and Best 2 Bulls for Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder.

The Cattlemen's Congress awards rosettes to all Division Champions and Reserve Champions and banners to Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions.

## JUNIOR PROSPECT HEIFER AND STEER CLASSES

- 1. Cattle must be raised and handled in a humane manner. No added hormones, anabolic steroids or sub-therapeutic feed antibiotics can be applied/fed.
- 2. Any cattle entered in junior classes must be solely owned by the junior exhibitor and registered with AHA in the exhibitor's name only.
- 3. All entries must comply with Livestock Health Requirements.
  - a) Absolutely no late entries will be accepted after the late entry deadline.
  - b) Entries with registrations pending, illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificates at check-in time are ineligible for competition.
  - c) Maximum height at hip to be shown in these classes is 45" on mature females and 48" on mature males. All entries will be weighed and measured at check-in. Those entries exceeding the height requirement will be disqualified from competition.
  - d) Surgery or other procedure performed to change the natural process of growth maturation, contour, or appearance of any animal, to include teeth, is prohibited. Not included is removal of teats or horns, clipping and dressing of hair, and trimming of hooves
  - e) Decision of the show superintendent will be final.
- 4. Ages: Must be 3-21 as of the day of the show.
- 5. \*\*\* NEW\*\*\* The Show Superintendent reserves the right to pull DNA on any or all animals at any time throughout the duration of Cattlemen's Congress!
- 6. All Miniature Hereford steers showing at the Cattlemen's Congress must be registered by the AHA and out of a registered sire and dam.
- 7. NEW FOR 2024 All Miniature Hereford steers will be required to be parent verified to both sire and dam, therefore, a DNA profile of the steer, the sire and dam must be completed through the official AHA lab by entry deadline of November 17th!. NO EXCEPTIONS!!

Any steer that does not have this process completed prior to the entry deadline of November 17th, will NOT be allowed to show! Refunds on entry fees will not be issued!
