

BEEFMASTER PROMOTION GROUP SANCTIONED OPEN SHOW

1. Exhibitors must be members of the Beefmaster Promotion Group (BPG). All cattle must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United (BBU). For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in a BPG approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases BPG and their respective officials, sponsors, agents, directors, employees and representatives, from any and all claims, liabilities, suits and judgments, arising from or connected with the administration or use of any animal test, rule enforcement and the resulting decision or action based thereon.
2. Animals entered in group classes must have been shown in an individual class.
3. Heifers exhibited at twenty-four (24) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy, by a licensed veterinarian, or be nursing their natural, purebred calf-at-side. If a calf is over 6 months old, cow must be palpated safe in the calf and so stated on health papers.
4. All bulls twenty (20) months of age or older that are exhibited must have passed a fertility examination given by a licensed veterinarian to be eligible to show.
5. All bulls 12 months old and older must be led with a nose lead at all times.
6. All animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not naturally lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained or pulled upwards or forwards. No animals may have any foreign objects attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
7. The BPG Code of Conduct will be enforced.

Rules for Advancer/E6 Female Show Division

1. Membership:

Exhibitors must be members of the Beefmaster Promotion Group (BPG). All cattle must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United (BBU). For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in a BPG approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases BPG and their respective officials, sponsors, agents, directors, employees and representatives, from any and all claims, liabilities, suits and judgments, arising from or connected with the administration or use of any animal test, rule enforcement and the resulting decision or action based thereon.

1. Eligibility:

All heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United (BBU) as an Advancer or Certified E6 as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws (no C registration numbers permitted on entry in show). Exhibitors must provide proof of registration upon entry. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf at side, must be presented to the show superintendent at the time of cattle check-in. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves less than 30 days of age must be presented.

Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check in.

2. DNA Verification:

All animals are required to have at least one completed BBU purebred parent, either sire and/or dam, verification on file at BBU prior to the show check-in.

*If an animal does not have DNA parent verification completed at that time, they will be ineligible to show. DNA parent verification is defined as having submitted DNA samples per the BBU DNA testing process of the animals being entered, their BBU purebred sire and/or dam, AND then having the show animal's genotype match that of the BBU registered purebred parent as determined by the BBU.

All animals exhibited in the show are subject to DNA marker test to verify accuracy of parentage and for any other testing as required by the individual show. Collection of DNA will be done by a nonpartisan individual designated by the Association and Livestock Show. Any DNA collected on animals exhibited in a BPG approved show is owned by and is the property of the Beefmaster Promotion Group. The BPG, and its representatives, have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited animals. Said authority shall extend to, and cover the enforcement of, all show rules as adopted by the BPG. Any refusal of DNA being collected, will be an automatic suspension from the Beefmaster Promotion Group.

3. Classes:

Classes will be determined and posted after all entries are checked in by BPG/BBU officials. Every effort will be made to keep classes uniform in age and size. Entries will Not be divided by division, all class winners and seconds will participate in the overall drive where Grand and Reserve Champion heifers will be selected.

Advancer/E6 heifers must be shown separately, although concurrently, with the Beefmaster.

Advancer/E6 are NOT eligible for exhibition in ANY purebred Beefmaster group classes.

4. Pair Eligibility:

An E6 cow with a bull calf at side is NOT eligible to show in the Advancer/E6 Show. All calves at the side of cows MUST be registered with BBU. To be eligible to show as a pair, all cows MUST have their BBU registered haltered calf at side.

If the calf at side is over 90 days of age by the date of show check-in, it must have parent verification completed by show check-in. If it is under 90 days, parent verification of the calf is not required.

5. Presentation/Fitting:

*Advancer/E6 exhibits are **NOT** subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be presented **blow and go**. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials leaving any residue are not permitted. Hair may be brushed according to preference with **NO** foreign substances/fitting materials on any part of the body.

**For Fall 25 Premium Books- follow BPG grooming/fitting guidelines for Advancer/E6.*

6. Awards: Champion and Reserve Champion Advancer/E6 Female will be awarded in each show.

8. Conduct:

Standard show rules and ethical guidelines apply.

9. Probationary Period:

The Advancer/E6 females will select a champion and reserve at each show, no divisions.

Advancer/E6 show points will be calculated independently as their own show. Advancer/E6 headcounts will NOT be calculated in/with purebred show numbers.

The Advancer/E6 females will only be eligible for

Advancer/E6 Champion & Reserve Show Heifer of the Year

and will **NOT** contribute points to any other Beefmaster Promotion Group Honor Roll awards.

1. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of Beefmaster Breeders United and the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association. When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the JBBA as well as the rules of the Show Management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the show rules, may be disqualified from showing.
2. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf at side, must be presented to the show superintendent at the time of cattle check-in. ALL Natural Service calves 30 days old and younger must present original registration papers or show proof of DigitalBeef Registration. ALL Artificial Insemination or Embryo Transfer calves 90 days old or younger must have a performance number and have DNA pending in the BBU Office before the National Show check-in. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check-in.
3. All heifers must be registered with BBU as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws.
4. Exhibitors must be a current member in good standing of the JBBA. Exhibitors must be a minimum of six years old on January 1st and under the age of twenty-one years on January 1st of the current year.
5. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he or she owns two or more entries in the same class, whereupon another bona fide JBBA exhibitor may show one of the entries. If the entry is a pair, the cow must be exhibited by the exhibitor.
6. Any heifer that, in the opinion of a designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed, shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be animals exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic, or physical defects.
7. All BBU registered animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the top line of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign objects attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums and awards.
8. Classes of animals shall be split as near to equal numbers as possible by the show superintendent.
